### **Updates from around the Gadbrook Park estate**

### Roads

All works were completed on Friday 20th May and the junction fully opened on Monday 23rd May. The original programme was expected to last nine weeks from the 28th Feb until 29th April. This overran by three weeks, with some of this delay due to the unfortunate timing of a burst water main.

#### **Estate Audits**

There have been a number of audits carried out by the BID Team from January to April and there was also a follow-up audit which took place after the storms. This was undertaken in order to check for debris or any damage to signs, boards or hoardings. Fly tipping, potholes and ground maintenance were also noted by the BID team during these checks.

The Default Judgement Application is still currently with the Court for Approval. Our solicitors have spoken with the Court and were advised that they are working through a backlog, however they are hopeful of having the final Order through shortly (subject to any further action that may be required). Our solicitors will continue to update on the situation and hopefully a copy of the final Order will be made available as soon as possible.

### **Be Vigilant**

There has been an increase in unwanted activity on the Business Park recently with both security and the Police having been alerted. If you see anything suspicious please make sure you report it. Together we can make Gadbrook Park as safe and secure as possible for everyone.
